**Matabililand, Mashonoland, & Tati Gold Fields.**

This Map defines the new Boundaries according to Treaties between England, Germany, and Portugal, dated August 1890, the positions of *Gold Reefs* in the *Tati District* and *Matabililand*, the *alluvial Gold Field* in the vicinity of the *Mazoe River*, *Mashonoland*, and the Portuguese Territory—*Sofala District*—referred to in the *Official Report* of *Lieut. Maund*. *Kraals*, *Mountains*, *Rivers*, *Altitudes*, and much useful detail are clearly shown. The extent of the *Gold Mining Concessions* is defined by colour. The Map extends from *Shoshong* to the *Zambesi*, the *River Shiré*, *Tette*, the mouths of the *Zambesi*, and southward to *Inhambane*.

**ROUTE TO MISSALE GOLDFIELDS.**  
Quillimane, Kwa Kwana River to Vincente. Up the Zambezi to TETE, 18 days and Karabassa Rapids, 300 miles. On up the Shire River, Lake Nyassa and the River to TETE, 18 days.

**AMBISE COMMERCE.**  
On this river, but the only means of transit is few boats. Thousands of canoes are engaged in the carrying trade.
