Dr. Tilmann Röder studied law and history in Göttingen and Berlin (Humboldt University) between 1994 and 2000. In 2000 he took his first state exam, and the second in 2005. Also in 2005, Dr. Röder received his Doctorate in Law at Johann Wolfgang Goethe University in Frankfurt am Main ("summa cum laude") with a thesis on the evolution of transnational business law. Since 2013 Dr. Röder has been a Managing Director at the Max Planck Foundation for International Peace and the Rule of Law. Besides, he served as pro bono Executive Director of the Kabul-based Hamida Barmaki Organization for the Rule of Law from 2013-2016. Between 2009 and 2012, Dr. Röder was head of the Middle East and Central Asia projects of the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law. More recently he built up a team supporting the peace process in Colombia. Dr. Röder's more recent publications include "Constitutionalism, Human Rights, and Islam after the Arab Spring" (with Rainer Grote, eds., Oxford University Press 2016) and "Non-state Justice Institutions and the Law: Decision-making at the Interface of Tradition, Religion and the State" (with Matthias Kötter et al., Palgrave Macmillan 2015). He is the founder and editor of the Journal of Afghan Legal Studies, and an editor of the Max Planck YearBook of United Nations Law (UNYB).
