

## **Emon, Anver**

Prof. Dr. Anver M. Emon is Professor of Law at the University of Toronto. He is an internationally recognized scholar of Islamic law who works across multiple legal traditions in both his research and teaching. His research focuses on premodern and modern Islamic legal history and theory; premodern modes of governance and adjudication; and the role of Shari'a both inside and outside the Muslim world. His general academic interests include topics in law and religion; legal history; and legal philosophy. In addition to publishing numerous articles, Emon is the author of "Islamic Natural Law Theories" (Oxford University Press, 2010), and "Religious Pluralism and Islamic Law: Dhimmis and Others in the Empire of Law" (Oxford University Press, 2012), as well as the co-editor of "Islamic Law and International Human Rights Law: Searching for Common Ground?" (Oxford University Press, 2012). He is the founding editor of "Middle East Law and Governance: An Interdisciplinary Journal", and series editor of the "Oxford Islamic Legal Studies Series".
